

# Paying For Study Abroad Grants and Scholarships



## Where to Start:

1. First, know that most, if not all, of your other scholarships, should be able to transfer over to your study abroad experience depending on the type of program you utilize.
2. When looking for additional scholarships, the first place to look is within your home university's study abroad or international education office.
3. Next research scholarships offered by the host school or host country for international students. An excellent place to check for these (besides the school's website) is <https://www.goabroad.com/scholarships-abroad/study-abroad> and enter your country of interest.

**This is by no means an all extensive list of scholarships, and there are countless study abroad providers, all of which typically have their own scholarships available. Be sure to do your research to get as much of your experience abroad paid for as you can. It is possible to study abroad for free or affordably, you just have to put in the effort to make it happen.**

  - b. Up to \$5,000 for Pell Grant Recipients
  - c. Due March or October
3. Boren Award- Scholars and Fellows:
  - a. <https://www.borenawards.org/>
  - b. only applies to programs **outside** of Western Europe, Canada, Australia, and New Zealand- preference goes towards students utilizing language programs or will be taking a foreign language class while abroad.
  - c. Up to \$25,000
  - d. Due February 1

  - b. \$1,000
  - c. Due March 15
5. Phi Kappa Phi Study Abroad Grants:
  - a. <https://www.phikappaphi.org/grants-awards/study-abroad>
  - b. Can be used for any program but are only available to students whose university has a Phi Kappa Phi chapter. You DO NOT need to be a member to apply. Schools in Colorado with chapters are CSU, CSU-Pueblo, Fort Lewis, and the Air Force Academy. If you attend school outside of Colorado, be sure to check if they have a chapter at your school.
  - c. \$1,000
  - d. Due March 15
6. Ashely Soulé Conroy Foundation Scholarship

  - b. The study abroad program must be a minimum of 14 weeks long.
  - c. \$4,000
  - d. Due June 1 or October 1
7. Diverse International Women of Color (DIWC) Scholarship
  - a. <https://diwcfund.org/diwc-scholarship/>
  - b. \$500
  - c. Due date varies, check the website
8. Hispanic Scholarship Fund
  - a. <https://www.hsf.net/scholarship>
  - b. Can be used for any program in which tuition is paid to the home university (typically exchanges or Faculty-led programs)
  - c. \$500-\$5,000
  - d. Due March 15
9. Voyager Scholarship from the Obama Foundation and AirBnB
  - a. <https://www.obama.org/voyager-scholarship/>
  - b. One of, if not, the best study abroad scholarships available to college Juniors and Seniors
  - c. Funds can be used for studying abroad and recipients receive a travel stipend to continue their exploration of the world post-graduation
  - d. Up to \$50,000
  - e. Due date varies, keep checking the website for updates

## Program-Specific Scholarships/Grants

1. Fund For Education Abroad (FEA) Scholarships

  - b. FEA scholarships are not limited to a single program provider but can only be utilized by programs offered by the many partner organizations to FEA.
  - c. Up to \$5,000
  - d. Due dates vary
2. IES Grants, Scholarships, and Need-Based Aid

  - b. Amounts vary and grants are given to qualifying students automatically. Some examples are HBCU Student Scholarships, HACU Institution Scholarships (for Hispanic Students-12 Colorado Schools), Public Institution Grants (CC, CU, CU-CS in Colorado), and the David Porter Need-Based Diversity Scholarship
  - c. Due April 1, May 1, or November 1, but with limited funds available, it's always best to apply early!

  - c. Due March 1, April 15, Oct 1

  - c. \$500- must keep a blog while abroad
  - d. Due Date- Not currently available due to COVID-19: check the website for updates
